#### **Terms and Conditions of Sale**

Please note that the first 20 lots in this auction, numbered 'A to T', will be auctioned by way of a 'Silent Auction' during the Convention itself on Thursday, June 16<sup>th</sup>, 2022. These lots will be available for you to view and place your bids at the auction table on the bourse floor.

- 1. This is an auction sale conducted by the Casino Collectibles Association (CCA) hereinafter referred to as "the Club" and "Auctioneer". Participation in the floor bidding of the sale will be limited to members of the Club unless otherwise pre-approved. The Auctioneer may not withdraw any lot after a call for bids from the floor of the sale has been made. This is an auction sale and not a fixed price list. This is not an approval sale. Lots may be returned only if there has been a misrepresentation of the merchandise. All sales will be considered final on the 30th day after the close of the sale. Lots are sold to the highest bidder as of the close of the sale on Thursday, June 16, 2022.
- 2. The highest bidder acknowledged by Auctioneer shall be the buyer. In the event of any dispute between bidders, the Auctioneer may at his sole discretion immediately put the lot up for sale again. The Auctioneer's decision shall be final and binding upon all bidders. The Auctioneer reserves the right to accept or reject any bid at his discretion. We will not accept a 'buy" bid on any lot. The Auctioneer reserves the right to refuse blanket or 'total value" bids. The Auctioneer reserves the right to refuse to honor any bid or to limit the amount of any bid which in his opinion is not submitted in "Good Faith" or as the case dictates, is not supported by satisfactory credit references, as the Auctioneer in its sole discretion shall determine. Reserved lots are noted, otherwise lots are unreserved. All advance bids for lots will be accepted on the floor of the convention until 4pm, Thursday, June 16, 2022, at which time ALL bidding will close for the Silent Auction Lots 'A to T'. The winning bids for those lots will be announced immediately prior to the start of Live Auction (Part II).
- 3. All bids are to be per lot as numbered in this catalog. No lots will be broken. The Auctioneer reserves the right to withdraw prior to a call for bids any lot or lots from the sale. Bids are to be submitted according to the bidding increments indicated below. Bids received in fractional amounts will be rounded down to the next bidding increment. If your bid is the highest bid we receive for the lot, and you comply with the terms of the sale, you will be the buyer of that lot. Raises in floor bidding will be made in the same fixed increments. There will be a minimum starting price of \$5 for all donated lots. The auctioneer may lower any starting prices in the auction room at his discretion only in the event of no bids whatsoever having been made except where a reserve or minimum starting price has been agreed with the vendor. Bidding thereafter will be in the following increments

- 4. A "buyer's fee" is payable by the buyer as part of the total purchase price. A "buyer's fee" of 10% of the winning bid price will be charged on all lots (RESERVED & UNRESERVED) in this sale. The buyer's fee will be added to the winning bid (i.e. a winning bid of \$100 will be charged \$10 buyers fee) and added to the invoice. Please calculate your bids accordingly.
- All sales are strictly for cash in U.S.A. dollars and are due and payable immediately upon receipt of the auction invoice or, if payment is to be made at the auction sale, then simultaneously with the receipt of the lots won. Bidder personally guarantees payment of all successful bids. Title to all items remains with the Auctioneer until full payment is effected. For lots sold to mail bidders, invoices will be prepared and mailed within 10 days after the sale closes. Payment is due upon receipt of invoice. All lots will be sent to the successful bidder upon receipt of payment. Lots delivered in the State of Nevada are subject to all applicable state and local taxes. All applicable taxes will be paid unless the buyer submits to the Auctioneer a valid resale permit. Shipping, handling, and transit insurance charges will be added to invoices for the lots delivered by mail. Overseas buyers must furnish their own insurance covering shipment. In the event that a successful bidder fails to pay all amounts due, the Auctioneer reserves the right to resell the merchandise or return it to the consignor and the buyer agrees to pay for the reasonable costs of such a sale including a seller's commissions, and also to pay any difference between the resale price and the price of his previously successful bid. All payments will be made to CCA (or CC&GTCC).

- 6. ALL SUCCESSFUL BIDDERS WHO ARE PRESENT AT THE CONVENTION (regardless of whether they were in the live auction room) must pay for their lots before the end of the convention with no exceptions. Settlement may be made at the auction table on Friday 17<sup>th</sup> or Saturday 18<sup>th</sup> June between 11am & 2pm.
- 7. Nevada Sales TAX will be added to the price of all lots purchased and taken at the time of the sale. Lots that are shipped out of Nevada to the buyer will not be charged sales tax, but will be subject to shipping and insurance charges per the schedule provided or as noted on specific lots in this catalog. Dealers with valid resale licenses MUST PROVIDE a copy of their resale number to the cashier to avoid sales tax.
- 8. All bidders who have mailing addresses outside the United States of America, the Territories of the USA, Canada or Mexico, or have addresses through the U.S. Military and persons who have APO or FPO box numbers may be asked to deposit with the Auctioneer 25% of the total amount bid in U.S.A. dollars unless terms and arrangements have been agreed in advance with the Auction Chairmen or Auctioneer. Any portion of such deposit not used will be promptly refunded after the sale.
- 9. The Auctioneer is selling only such right or title to the merchandise being sold as Auctioneer may have by virtue of his consignment agreements on the date of sale and disclaims any warranty of title to the merchandise. Any description of the gaming checks, gaming tokens or other items contained in this catalog is for the sole purpose of identifying the items in the lot and no description of the lots has been made part of the basis of the bargain or has created any express warranty that the goods would conform to any description made by the Auctioneer. The Auctioneer disclaims any warranty of merchantability or fitness for any particular purpose. All lots are guaranteed to be genuine.
- 10. The descriptions provided in this catalog are intended solely for the use of those bidders who cannot view the lots in person prior to bidding. All bidders who have inspected the lots prior to the auction will not be granted any return privileges, except for reasons of authenticity. It is presumed that all floor bidders have inspected the lots prior to bidding. Therefore, lots purchased by floor bidders are sold "as is" and may NOT be returned. Floor bidders include those bidders acting as agent for others. No claims of any kind (except for reasons of authenticity) can be considered after the settlements have been made with the consignors. Any dispute after the settlement date, June 19, 2021, is strictly between the bidder and consignor without involvement or responsibility of the Auctioneer. The Auctioneer or affiliates may consign items to be sold in this auction sale, and may bid on those items or any other in the sale. The Auctioneer or affiliates expressly reserves the right to modify its bids on these items or any others at any time based upon data made known to the Auctioneer or its affiliate. In the event of an attribution error, the Auctioneer may, at the Auctioneer's sole discretion, correct the error orally at the sale, or, if discovered at a later date, to refund the buyer's money without further obligation. Under no circumstances shall the obligation of the Auctioneer to any bidder be in excess of the buyer's premium for any lot in dispute. If any disputes arise regarding payment or authenticity, or grading between bidder and Auctioneer, or any other matter pertaining to the sale, the bidder, a participant or the Auctioneer the dispute shall be submitted, if otherwise mutually unresolved to binding arbitration in accordance with the rules of the American Arbitration Association (A.A.A.). If an election not made within (10) days of an unresolved dispute, Auctioneer may elect the Casino Collectibles Association (CCA). An award granted in arbitration enforceable in any court. BY THE ACT OF PLACING BIDS IN THIS AUCTION, YOU ARE AGREEING TO THE TERMS OF SALE. As stated in the call for lots, there will be a 10% commission fee to the seller on all RESERVED & UNRESERVED lots.
- 11. Consignors have the right to protect their own UNRESERVED lots by bidding in advance, by proxy or in the live auction room. A consignor that buys back his lot will pay the regular 10% buyers premium but the 10% sellers commission will be waived.
- 12. Estimates of the value of lots are based on our knowledge of the market and rarity of the item. Book values rather than estimates are provided where appropriate. Reserve lots are noted. All other lots in the sale are to be sold without reserve. Lots have been fully described as accurately as we can. Grading of the lots is generally based on the OFFICIAL CCA GRADE & CONDITION DESCRIPTIONS.

GRADING DESCRIPTIONS or STANDARDS are a result of natural use of chips and tokens. The following five grades have been adopted and endorsed by the Casino Collectibles Association: NEW, SLIGHTLY USED, AVERAGE, WELL-USED and POOR. In some cases we may also use VSU (between New and SU).

#### **GAMING CHECKS & CHIPS:**

GRADE DESCRIPTION OF GRADE

New (N) Never used in games; square and round edge chips will be as from the

manufacturer with absolutely no wear, no dings or nicks; no scratches on surface of

chip or inlay.

Slightly Used (SU) Only slight signs of use, edge still crisp but ever so slightly dulled with very

little wear; cross hatching may show slight wear near edge; few or no edge nicks;

still retains luster in mold design; bold hot-stamp; inlays excellent.

Average (A) Typical chip found in play after months/years of use; slightly rounded edges; will

have minor defects such as small nicks on edges; inlays are beginning to show even wear and about half of the cross hatching has worn from the body surface; hotstamps have dulled, beginning to show even wear and may be missing a small

amount of foil.

Well-Used (WU) Moderate and uniform wear of edge, surface and hot stamp; noticeable edge nicks

and/or surface scratches; no luster in mold design; cross hatching is nearly worn off;

hot-stamp is still readable but much of the foil is missing.

Poor (P) Edges that were formerly sharp and square, are now well worn like bicycle tires;

Original hot-stamp foil is mostly missing with only the recesses visible (may have to hold towards a light); moderate to large chips (nicks); surface cross hatching barely visible (if at all); severe scratches to inlay or chip surface; severe color fading; partial war up to half of CHIPCO design from the edge of the chip. (Damage, such as cracks, breaks, missing inlay or other chip structure, does not apply to this

category.)

Specimen, Sample, Produced by the manufacturer as imprimaturs of a type of chip, or for

Prototype, Pattern submission to a gaming operator or gaming control authority as representative, for

approval. May or may not be completely finished.

#### How to Bid in the Auction

Thank you for your interest in our 2021 CCA Auction sale. We are happy to offer an outstanding selection of gaming checks from around the world and Nevada. Please read our terms of sale carefully. We wish you luck in your bids. Some of the following information will assist you in your bids.

We will not accept a "buy" bid on any lot. We reserve the right to refuse "blanket" or "total value" bids. We reserve the right to reject any bid.

We have illustrated all of the lots. We feel that many of the lots are nicer than they might appear in the illustrations. Please realize that the financial limitations of reproducing photos at a reasonable cost in a small catalog can govern our quality. We have made every effort to correctly describe the lots and give a true evaluation of their condition. All of the lots have been graded based on CCA grading standards for checks, tokens or other material.

We will be taking advance bids prior to the convention this year. Also, club members will have the opportunity to request a proxy bid for any lot in the auction. Any club member that would like to either bid in advance, or have a member of the auction committee serve as proxy bidder on their behalf, email (preferred) or mail their bids to the auction chairman at the address below. Please indicate the lot# and your maximum bid for each lot and whether you

are bidding in advance or by proxy. Of course, please include your name, address, and club membership number. Advance and proxy bids must be RECEIVED no later than Tuesday, June 7, 2022.

Please remember to bid in accordance with the bidding increments stated in the terms and conditions above, and also that in the event of equal bids, the earliest received will take precedence.

#### Lot A \$1 and \$5 Baccarat chips from Aladdin, Las Vegas, NV

Mold: House Minimum Bid: \$5 Condition: Average

From: 2000

The Aladdin Resort and Casino opened in 2000 at the current site of the Planet Hollywood Casino. It had a high roller room in the center of the casino called the London Club. These two 43mm chips were used in their Baccarat games.

#### Lot B 5 Bighorn Casino NCV, North Las Vegas, NV

Joe's Longhorn Casino became the Bighorn in 1997. They had table games until about 2011, when they became a slots-only casino (they have a sports book as well). This is a first-issue \$5 no cash value chip that's been out of circulation for at least 10 years.

#### Lot C 3 Brothel chips and one from Paris, Various

Here's a group of 4 chips with pictures of pretty women. The first three are brothel advertising chips from the Calico Club in Battle Mountain, the Villa Joy in Winnemucca, and the Roadhouse in Lovelock. The  $4^{\rm th}$  chip has a picture of Paris Hilton.

The Caravan Motel on the Strip became the Caravan TraveLodge, which later became the Nob Hill Casino, and is now part of the Casino Royale. This is a nice old advertising chip from the original property.

The Cincinnati Reds' Community Fund holds an annual Celebrity Poker Tournament. There is a \$200 entry fee (presumably tax deductible), and for that you can play alongside current and former Reds players, coaches and broadcasters. These are two of the chips used in these tournaments.

This is a plain vanilla \$25 from the Claim Stake Casino in Sparks, Nevada. There is an image of a mine entrance, and... wait. It looks like one of the insert pairs is flipped, making this an error chip. Maybe never seen before, this could be a unique piece.

#### Lot G 3 ND chips from Colony Club, Reno, NV

The Colony Club operated at 254 N. Virginia Street in downtown Reno from 1946 to 1964. This is a lot of three non-denomination chips from the early years that are now close to 80 years old and in beautiful condition.

Now known as the Crystal Casino and Hotel, the Crystal Park Casino was owned by Leo Chu, who also owned the Hollywood Park Casino. This chip was used in their high stakes games and is now canceled with a pinhole.



The Foxwoods Casino is now the 2<sup>nd</sup> largest casino in the United States, (behind the Winstar in Oklahoma.) When it opened in 1992, it was the biggest in the world. In 1994, they issued an interesting group of 4 \$10 chips depicting some of the most famous singers in the world... Pavarotti, Anka, Tony Bennett and this one showing Sinatra.

The Paddlewheel was located on Convention Center Drive at the former location of the Royal Inn. It would later become the Debbie Reynolds Hotel & Casino. This is a set of no cash value chips manufactured in the clover mold in use at the Paddlewheel, which was open from 1983 to 1991.

The South Coast Casino was opened in December of 2005 by Coast Casinos (which later became part of Boyd Gaming). It struggled early on, and Michael Gaughan, the founder of Coast Casinos, took it over in October of 2006 and changed the name to the South Point. This is a group of roulettes that were briefly on the tables before the name change.

Trader Dick's was a vintage restaurant/Tiki bar/casino that was initially located across the street from the Nugget Casino in Sparks, later moving into the actual Nugget Casino. It opened in 1958 and closed in 2014. This is a scarce non-denomination chip from Trader Dick's.

In 1976 the Paradise Casino opened on Tropicana Avenue just east of the Tropicana Hotel. The following year it became the 20<sup>th</sup> Century, which it remained for just two years before becoming the Treasury in 1978. In 1989 it was renamed the Hotel San Remo and in 2006 it became Hooters, and finally in 2019 it became the OYO. This inlaid \$5 was on the tables for a short time in 1978.


This is a beautiful antique crest and seal, an illegal used at the 49 Camp in the Bay Area of NoCal. In beautiful condition for a centenarian.







In 1968 the Sonoma Inn, which had been in operation since 1947 closed down. The Winners Inn opened in this location in 1969 and on the roulette table were these horseshoe mold hot stamped chips that are very scarce. Finding 5 different colors in a single auction should be considered a bonanza.
