Linked HERE is a Dealer Contract for the June 2024 Convention.

GOOD NEWS - no increase in table fees or admission fees for 2024...

GOOD NEWS #2 – for 2024 we are offering the opportunity for any dealer who had tables for the 2023 show to purchase one additional table for the discounted rate of \$140.00.

Here is the fine print conditions:

The bonus table is available as an additional table above the number of tables you had in 2023. Example – if you had two single tables or one corner table you would be able to add one single bonus table. If you had one single table, you could add one bonus table. If you had three single tables, you could add one bonus table. See the pattern? The bonus table is over and above the number of tables you had in 2023. If you had two single tables, you could not sign up for one regular price table and a bonus table. Only one bonus table available per dealer.

By adding additional tables to the show floor, table positions from 2023 may change slightly but every effort will be made to honor your placement requests based on the Dealer Point System, 2023 floor plan and final table floor plan.

Please read your contract and abide by the content. Load-in and set-up instructions will be sent to each dealer advising the date, time, and hours of access to show floor.

I will send confirmation of receipt of your contract. Based on postal service please allow two weeks after mailing your contract and check. If you have not received confirmation by then contact me at: Convention@ccgtcc.com, or jimsteffner@mail.com.

Greetings to my fellow CCA members. I have decided to run for office of Vice President this election cycle because I am concerned that our Club is not heading in a good direction. There are many issues that need to be dealt with so that our Club will prosper in the future. The many questions that stick in



my mind are what does our Club stand for? What is our purpose? Why do people join our Club? Why are they not joining our Club? Why are they not renewing? How are we advancing our hobby? As a member for 11 years, I have participated in many areas of the Club and have achieved many accomplishments and now wish to be part of the solution to advance us to the pinnacle of the hobby. We were at one time the foremost authority on the hobby but because we have become complacent, other Clubs and Websites have left us in dust. With your vote I will strive to be involved in the many facets of our Club and the hobby as I have done for so many years and answer these questions and find Answers. I have the motivation and drive to get things done.

Platform

The following are items I will pursue for the Club to better enhance our presence and increase our place as the top Casino Collectibles Club in the world.

Exposure We need to get our name out and publicize our Involvement in the Hobby world and the General public. My thoughts are to conduct a Charity event where we co-brand with another High-profile Company to get maximum exposure. I would consider a Poker Tournament, Golf tournament and any other activity to get our name out there. Part of the proceeds would be donated to the co-sponsor to entice them to join us. My particular favorite, whom I have had a good relationship is with the Make a Wish Foundation. I conducted an event in Denver as a Board member of the Denver Chapter of the Mercedes Club. I would like to form a small committee to explore this possibility. The Duke of Fremont Street could help us in this endeavor. We also need to form partnerships with like clubs to advance our identity. There are many Clubs local and national that may be in the same boat as us and would be willing to form a consortium/ Association for mutual benefit.

State Tax Exempt Status I attempted this during my Presidency and narrowly lost the appeal by one vote. It is worth another attempt as the cost to apply is minimal. I spent 5 months on this project but feel I may prevail this time around. The attempt is worth the reward. I will seek out the legal eagles of our club to make a very concentrated effort to get this done.

Grants One of the main reasons I pursued the corporate transfer from New York to Nevada was to pursue Grants. It is a lot easier to and less cumbersome to receive Federal grants with a lot less people applying for them. We have a greater chance of any request being granted. We are already a federal tax-exempt corporation and with our MoGH and CCA Club credentials we have a good chance in achieving success. I will ask that a committee be formed to determine what the in's and outs are. I received some contact information from Jonathon Ullman the President of the Mob Museum to help layout a roadmap.

If we were to receive any type of Grant we could designate a myriad of special projects which would include a Brick-and-Mortar Museum, Public Relation Marketing Personnel to gain national prominence and any other worthwhile endeavor the Cub could suggest. I will give this all the attention I can to achieve success.

Website During my tenure as President we came very close to achieving a new website. I have thoughts on how to make it more user friendly and have the prototype that was designed with my board members at the time. I believe I could make a difference and satisfy some of the concerns I have seen on the boards. Kudos to those that brought it to fruition so far, but we can make it better. We also need to rethink the Website as a viable way of promoting our Club. We need to drive the public and the membership to our site so that we can tell our story.

Transparency We need more concerning the inner workings of the Club board. More open communication as to what proposals are being discussed and what decisions are being made in a timelier fashion.

Contact/ Communication We should have some online Zoom meetings more frequently as the once-a-year Business meeting held at the Annual Convention does not suffice. Last year the Business meeting was cut too short at approximately one hour+ or -

CCA Magazine Our editors do an excellent job in putting together a First-Class publication. We fall short many times because of lack of content. We have so many members who have a wealth of knowledge in the history of Gaming. I would give a high priority to seeking out these individuals to share their knowledge before it's too late. The magazine costs an exorbitant amount of money, we need to get the maximum bang for our buck.

In Closing

I would like to say that ever since I joined this Club I have been active in almost every aspect of this Club. I know its inner workings and feel I have contributed more than most in terms of time and money. Everything I have done is for the betterment of our organization and the hobby.

At one time I was President of 3 related clubs. This was not an ego thing but rather I was called upon by members of these organizations. They saw in me a true passion for getting things done to make things better for all. I am not a dealer nor do have any vested interest in personally making money but rather I enjoy doing my best to help the Club succeed in every aspect.

The hobby is alive and doing well, the same needs to be said about us and with your vote you will empower me again to get involved. We need to start thinking outside the box to get us on a good path.

Talk is Cheap action speaks volumes. I am able to start projects and finish them.

"Trail of the MoGH" Exhibits Update - The Jackie Gaughan Tribute

As the MoGH's Director of Exhibits and Events I had a meeting with the GM of the El Cortez, where the MoGH's "Jackie Gaughan Tribute" Exhibit is housed. Mr. Weisberg, through a prior meeting with Charles Kaplan had offered an additional location within the El Cortez for the MoGH to display more El Cortez artifacts.

Inside the El Cortez there is a hallway that connects the coin-operated slot

machine area and the main casino area, as breezeway between the two sides of the building. That hallway is named the "Hallway of History" and is used to hang historic, large sized, framed Las Vegas News Bureau photographs. Towards the West end of the hallway is a no longer used service window, previously used as a pass-through from the hall to the security office. This service window has since been blocked off (on the security office side) leaving an opening of about 38" (h) x 36" (w) x 3" (d), with a lockable, clear glass, sliding window on the hallway side that Mr. Wiesberg would like filled with casino collectibles.

This Project has been completed, and is documented in the next issue of the Club's Award winning publication, the <u>Casino Collectibles News</u>, through which we will premier this new addition.

As noted in the last CCA Newsletter, I was contacted by the CEO of the Plaza Hotel and Casino, Downtown Las Vegas, where the MoGH has another "Trail of the MoGH" Exhibit. This Exhbit is dedicated to thehistory of the PLAZA and the CEO, Mr. Jonathan Jossel, has invited the MoGH to refresh the existing Exhibit and if desired and workable, expand the Exhibit further.

This development is also documented in the next issue of the Club's

magazine and will be detailed in-full, in the next issue of the CCA Newsletter as we will be deeper into the Project.

However, there is a recent development (occuring after the article was submitted to the CCN) which is a donation being made to the MoGH from the Plaza Hotel and Casino, pictured here.

2024 Convention and Show preparations:

Educational Seminar Speakers:

News From Around the Hobby

A Co-Branding Opportunity

Following a CCA Member's suggestion, posted on the ever-popular TheChipBoard.com message board, pertaining to reaching out to other hobby organizations to co-advertise or exchange Dealer Table access, at respective events, a "contact us" email was sent to the "Front Row Card Show" organization. Requested was an opportunity to discuss such an arrangement.

Specifically asked was if they would entertain the exchange of a Dealer Table at our 31st Annual Convention and Show in June, for a Dealer Table at their April 2024 Las Vegas Show?

While not ruled out in the future, there was a complication for this year, in that our Convention and Show coincides with a Show they are doing the same weekend in Arizona. They cannot cover both events with their few employees, as they are not volunteer supported and instead operate as a business.

In an effort to keep the dialog going, in the event of a change in the future, it was explained that the CCA Show includes a table where members and approved non-members/businesses can place their advertising flyers/cards.
