LAS VEGAS (February 17, 2022) — [The Museum of Gaming History](#) (MoGH) has elected James Hogg of Las Vegas as its newest member of the non-profit organization’s Board of Directors. The Museum of Gaming History currently sponsors eight unique gaming memorabilia exhibits located in several Las Vegas casinos and museums, offering visitors and casino history enthusiasts a unique opportunity to view gaming through the lens of the city’s past.
