Explore the Vegas "Age of Atomic Tourism" in New Exhibit

The Museum of Gaming History opens exhibit at National Atomic Testing Museum

LAS VEGAS, Nevada (April 4, 2022) — "You'll have a Blast in Las Vegas!" The latest Museum of Gaming History (MoGH) exhibit gives visitors a glimpse at how the gaming industry of Las Vegas used the fascination of A-bomb nuclear testing in the 1950s as a tourist attraction. 1970s and 1980s to attract visitors. The unique exhibit is on display at the <u>National Atomic Testing</u> Museum (NATM).



The National Atomic Testing Museum, a Smithsonian Affiliate, is a national science, history and educational foundation that tells the story of America's nuclear weapons testing program at the Nevada Test Site. The museum is located at 755 E. Flamingo Road in Las Vegas.



The Museum of Gaming History utilizes a novel concept that offers a unique way for casino history enthusiasts to explore more of Las Vegas, while viewing it through the lens of the city's past. The MoGH currently sponsors eight unique gaming memorabilia exhibits located all over town.
