About Dennis Blair....

Funnyman and award winning song writer and musician Dennis Blair steps to the microphone twice to entertain attendees at Casino Collectible's Association annual convention at Las Vegas' South Point Casino.

Blair, who for over 30 years toured with Rodney Dangerfield, Joan Rivers, Tom Jones and George Carlin, has made a career of clean comedy and music, winning awards for song and screen writing.

The New York native will be the keynote speaker at the Early Bird banquet June 16 and close festivities entertaining at the Volunteers' Reception. The multi-talented entertainer has achieved success performing comedy, music and combined both for a night with parodies of audience favorites, slyly warning, "Let me ruin all your memories."

Comedy came later for Blair, whose career began as a singer/musician entertaining guests with 60's rock and roll, Simon and Garfunkel and the Beatles tunes at New York weddings and bar mitzvahs.

Summoning up the courage to give comedy a try, he took the late night stage at Dangerfield's Comedy Club one evening. The club hired him on the spot as their opening act...a title that stuck with him for decades.

He remembers thinking, "I guess I'm a comedian now." A few nights later, the club's owner, Rodney Dangerfield, caught Blair's act and offered him the opportunity to go on the road as the comedian's opener, taking him from the small stage to 3000-seat theaters. For the next 27 years, Blair travelled the world opening for headliners.

Blair also composed the rap influenced, Grammy nominated novelty song for Dangerfield, "Rappin' Rodney" which became a hit on the fledgling MTV and he became a major collaborator writing the movie *Easy Money*. He won an Emmy Award for the short, *Confessions of a Standup* and wrote a one-man Broadway show for Jackie Mason.

Joan Rivers hired Blair away from Dangerfield as her opening act and brought him along for appearances when she hosted *The Tonight Show.* Later, his one-year tenure with Tom Jones ended when the singers' ego was bruised by a New Jersey reviewer who credited, "Blair is half the show." Then came Carlin.

In an industry where most performers experience long stretches of down time, Blair recalled, "I was never unemployed until the day after George Carlin died." Originally Carlin had offered a 3-month tour but "I ended up with him for 20 years."

Now a Las Vegas resident, Blair's musical trio performs regularly at the newly opened Brad Garrett's Comedy Club inside MGM Grand and Friday's he joins the band trio at Kenny Davidsen's Bow Tie Cabaret inside Tuscany Casino on East Flamingo.

Most months, Blair is featured performing his original music at Keith Thompson's legendary Composer's Showcase inside Myron's Cabaret Jazz at the Smith Center for the Performing Arts. He and Davidsen continue their popular Simon and Garfunkel tribute and Blair performs his comedy on cruise lines and comedy clubs across the country.

"I wanted to bring more entertainment to our opening night banquet," said Casino Collectibles Association President, Jerry Vergatos. "We've had some great speakers in the past but Dennis gives us the added element of entertainment. And he's a very funny guy."

Hi to all 2022 Convention Dealers.

It is time to start thinking about this year's Convention.

There is a link for the contract for the 2022 Convention.

General Information

Location - We will again be using Convention halls C & D like we did last year. The Banquet will be held in Hall D, also like last year. We will again be allowed to use the large space behind the *curtain* wall. There will be more activity in that particular space as I am soliciting more vendors and attempting to get Casino Equipment manufacturers to have displays of new and upcoming products. Similar to a mini G2E-type show. I have tried this in the past and will continue to pursue this idea.

Protocol - As of today, the curtains used between the Dealers will not be there. Of course, if there is a mandate, we will have to comply. This is a very fluid situation. More information will be given out closer to the Convention.

Spacing - There will be a 3 ft. spacing between the tables, similar to last year. My thoughts are that the spacing gave the dealers more space in the front of their table to accommodate more customers as well as a better access point to get behind their table(s). Having that extra space made our Show look a lot bigger and utilized the massive space better.

Contract - Please, **PLEASE**, PRINT clearly all the information on the Contract. I had a hard time with some of the handwriting and I don't want to make any mistakes with the information. The information from

the Contract will be entered into a database as the information goes to different Convention Chairs. When completing the Contract please make sure the Membership Numbers are stated, as well as the location where you and your Helpers are to pick up the Registration Packets. All Dealers and Helpers must be CCA members. To verify your Membership numbers and status please contact Roy Nelson at: rnelson4338@gmail.com

Chairs - You will notice that I have increased the number of chairs for the tables. A standard table will now have 3 chairs included in the rental and a corner table will now have 5 chairs. Additional chairs will also be available for the usual \$5 each. You may set up the chairs anyway you wish either by having one in the back and two in front, or vise versa. Your choice. You are welcome to bring your own personal chairs as long as they are placed behind your table and not in front.

Dealer Placement - Dealer placements are based on the loyalty point system used. This system is used with preference to seniority points determined by the past number of tables rented and the number of times the Dealer has been present at the past Conventions. There are 2 deadlines, one for the point system to be counted, and the contract must be received by January 31st with the payment, please refer to #10 in the

However, their points may still be high enough to allow them to regain their usual location on the floor. The final deadline referenced on Page 5 is now April 1, 2022.

Becoming a CCA Life Member

Any Club member interested in becoming a Life Member, should note the following qualifications as excerpted from the Club's Constitution:

E. Life Members: members in good standing <u>age 25 or</u> older who apply, after completion of their third full year of membership for permanent membership status, and whose applications are accompanied by payment, according to the following schedule. Life Members are relieved from paying further annual dues, but must pay any magazine mailing charges above bulk mail, if the Life Member desires such mailing enhancement:

Age 25-39: then-current dues times 25

Age 40-55: then-current dues times 20

Age 55+: then-current dues times 15

After 10 years of continuous completed membership the following rates would apply:

Age 56-75: then-current dues times 10

Age 76+: then-current dues times 5;

E (i). Dues Changes Impacting Life Members: if the Board of Directors raises the organization's annual general membership dues, thus impacting the Life Membership cost to someone who at that time has been a member for less than three years, the Board of Directors may, in its discretion, grandfather in all those members who have been members for less than three (3) years, so that those members, once they have completed their third year, may become life members by paying the multiplier times the annual dues in effect when they first became a regular member. The member must pay the increased annual dues until the completion of the third year. At the completion of the third year, the member has a one-time only, two month window to apply for Life Membership at the grandfathered lower rate.

CCA TO MEET AT ANA CONVENTION IN COLORADO SPRINGS





Bahamian Rhapsody - The history of casinos in the Bahamas.

Charles Kaplan is the current Chairman of the Museum of
Gaming History. He is also the curator of the ChipGuide, the
most comprehensive reference guide available for casino chip
collectors, featuring a free on-line image database of over
285,000 gaming chips and memorabilia from worldwide casinos.
Kaplan's presentation will cover the time period after the mob
was kicked out of Cuba by Castro's revolution, when they sought
other venues to ply their trade. The nearby Bahamas was one of
their first targets. Gambling was illegal in the Bahamas until the
Duke of Windsor, then the Governor of the Bahamas, issued an
exemption for a seasonal casino at a private club on Cat Cay
Island in 1939. The story is complicated and complex involving
corrupt government officials, swindlers, the mob, a future
President of the United States, a television celebrity and several

As a teenager, Rich was the youngest cabana boy and beach lifeguard at the famous Eden Roc hotel. As his responsibilities grew, he rubbed elbows with many well-known Jewish businessmen who were "connected" with the New York Syndicate and the Italian Mafia. Seminar: Friday, June 17 at 3 p.m.








So ended Gregg Fisher's twelve-week wait for acceptance, the time required for the review process Guinness undergoes after most world record attempts are submitted.

The documentation necessary to confirm each and every one of the 2,222 tokens and chips were each from actual yet different casinos was very exacting. Each was authenticated by independent witnesses pre-approved by Guinness – in this case from Spinettis Gaming Supplies – and was documented by spreadsheet, photo and video count.

"The record is based on the largest number of items over a single subject in a private personal collection," says Fisher. "In this case, only one chip or token from a specific casino is counted. So, in my case, the number of items in this Guinness World Record represents the same number of different casinos. I cannot thank Spinettis enough for all of the assistance provided on my record quest."

A display of the new World's largest casino chip and token collection, as recognized by Guinness World Records, will be a focal point on the floor at the CCA's 29th annual Show, June 16-18, 2022, at the South Point Hotel and Casino in Las Vegas. It will be a great addition

CONTRACT PROVISIONS

- The dealer table assigned to each member cannot be sold, rented, loaned or leased by any other individual during the convention without the approval of the Convention Chairman.
- The cancellation of the rental agreement or failure to appear for the CCA.
 Convention will result in the loss of all payments.
- 3) Although the South Point Hotel does not offer electrical service to the individual dealer tables, they have an arrangement with an electrical contractor to do all of the Convention power supply. Information will be in the future dealer packet. You will need to contact the vendor directly if you need electrical service.

Please plan accordingly.

4) Dealers are allowed to sell ONLY CASINO RELATED COLLECTIBLE MATERIALS or COINS unless pre-approved otherwise, by the Chairman.

- 5) NON-GENUINE items are expressly prohibited, unless such articles are clearly and plainly marked as "reproductions", "copies", "fakes", "repaired" or "fantasy" items.
- 7) It is understood that the CCA does not provide insurance against any damage or loss suffered by fire, theft, accident or personal injury and the signor of this contract further agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the CCA, its officers, agents, volunteers, and participants against any and all such claims by the signor and on behalf of any and all co-workers, helpers, assistants, and anyone else with a dealer badge from the signor's table or working behind the dealer's table.
- 8) Table priority for the 2022 Convention will be given to previous table holders in good standing, and then to new applicants based on date received. If, in the future, the space available is insufficient to meet table demand, table priority will be determined as follows: First priority goes to table holders from the previous Convention and then to past table holders from prior conventions.
- 9) All dealers are required to keep their table(s) open, and wares displayed for the FULL HOURS OF THE SHOW. There will be no breaking down table space early. Any dealer who violates this provision may be banned from future Conventions or face other sanctions.
- 10) If a prior year dealer does not submit an application by the deadline (With a postmark date of no later than January 31, 2022), the dealer will not have priority based on points, but will get priority based on date of submission after the deadline, along with all other "after the deadline" submissions. This means that a prior year dealer will not be assigned as good of a location as if the prior year dealer had submitted the application within the allowed deadline.
