CCA President Candidate Statement - David Spragg

The position of President is best served by someone with a thorough knowledge of the workings of the Club, its legal requirements and its finances. Recent events have borne that out. As a current Board member who has currently served for 11 years, I believe I am best placed of all candidates to take on the position, having been considerably involved in just about all facets of Club business at some time or other. I also have a good working relationship with the other Board members and have long been well known across the hobby.

It is a tireless position, often occupying several hours a day, and requires someone reliable with considerable 'work time' hours available. Anyone who has held the position before alongside fulltime external employment knows that it's almost impossible to give the role their full attention. There are many projects that were discussed during the past couple of terms which were not brought to fruition, and I will be doing my best to make sure that does not happen again. Please also remember this is initially just an interim position for the remainder of the current term. We will go through the whole process again starting in January 2023. Right now the club needs stability and an experienced head.

Immediate actions are to find a new Raffle Chair & Convention Chair, or at least a co-chair to assist Jim Steffner. These are two of the most important volunteer positions and the duties pretty much run all year round. Preparation for the next year starts almost as soon as each convention is over.

I am also keen to take advantage of those that wish to contribute regularly but don't want to hold an important volunteer position on their own. I am against the expansion of the current 5 person voting BoD but would seek to add others either by way of advisory groups, or small committees rather than single volunteers, to handle such things as social media and the club website. I'd also like to make it clear that any such appointments would be made by agreement of the whole BoD. In conjunction with important volunteers, the Club is supposed to be governed by the BoD, not the President alone, so a re-focus is necessary. The BoD is supposed to function as a team, with advice and assistance from other volunteer positions, with the President driving the team efforts and managing the available resources.

There are many reasons why the BoD's board meetings cannot be public. However I would like to revert to the procedure we had several terms ago where decisions affecting the membership would be posted publicly, and look to build on a recent suggestion where members can directly put forward questions to the BoD for discussion. For those who wish to maintain anonymity, the 'suggestion box' feature still remains available.

I think most of the membership knows me well enough to determine whether I am suitable for this position so I will just take this opportunity to mention things that will inevitably be brought up during the election process.

In the same way that it is too much for anyone to combine the President and Convention Chair roles effectively, I appreciate that it may be too much for me to continue as both day to day Webmaster and co-Auction Chair if elected. The Website re-development is still a key task to be undertaken following a failed project that sadly the 4 remaining BoD members were not involved in until it was too late. It is unfortunate that the Club does not have the financial resources available, nor is our organisation large enough, to justify the bespoke system our last President desired. Nevertheless it is an important area for me, albeit with some compromise, that I would like to see some of our own volunteers at least partially involved in.

A few people seem to think that my other business interests cause a conflict of interest. Well, aside from the fact that nothing changes in that I will remain a Board member regardless of the election outcome, I would have thought that



my ability to supply goods (convention chips, plaques & pins) and services (website hosting) to the Club either free of charge or at cost (saving us several thousand dollars a year) was a good thing. I am not the first Board member to be a dealer at the convention, and I won't be the last.On the rare occasions that any vote is necessary in this area, I don't vote as it is, so nothing changes there.

I would also like to state that while entitled to some expenses, and contrary to the belief of many it appears, I do not claim or receive any travel or hotel costs for any Club business. Neither do I claim any other expenses bar those mentioned above.

Sadly, just as we always wish we had more volunteers, too small a proportion of members exercise their right to vote in BoD elections, so, in advance, I therefore ask for your support by way of vote in the forthcoming election. Make your vote count.
